Guessing is not a reading strategy but rather prevents true reading from taking place and so
it must be avoided at all costs.
The urge to guess is very strong in many children.

'On top' is a concept some children struggle with. Help your child to understand what 'on top' means with this book. It will of course help your child learn to read as well!
